The purpose of the “Blueprint for Business Safety and Security” workshop is to provide information to business owners of safety and security hazards to their business and to identify reasonable, appropriate, and cost-effective measures to counter business risks for the avoidance of possible negligent security litigation claims.

“Impact of OSHA Requirements” (Discussion of OSHA requirements applicable to all businesses, compliance with required actions, and permissible employee actions.)

“Conducting Internal Investigations” (Discussion of the choice of an impartial investigator, confidentiality of the investigative process, Weingarten Rights, use of interpreters and statement taking.)

”Conducting a Comprehensive Background Investigation” (Discussion of background investigation methods, verifying data, Federal Credit Report Act (FCRA) requirements, investigative timelines, and implications of social media and sex offender lists.)

“Panel Discussion” (Discussion of safety and security concerns of attendees.)

“Stop the Bleed” (Discussion of methods to assist in the event of a medical emergency.)

Business Owner Breakout Session

“Selecting a Competent Security Vendor” (Discussion of developing a security vendor contract, identifying required vendor capabilities, including personnel selection and training and project supervision and management.)

”Developing a Workplace Violence Program” (Discussion of the definition of workplace violence, potential violence indicators, mitigating potential violence situations and appropriate response actions.)
